This is undoubtedly thanks to our committed coop members, co-workers and solid partnerships, which enabled us to navigate through the last stages of the pandemic and its economic consequences with a steady hand and continue our work on B-corp, Carbon Neutrality, Environmental preservation and restoration as well as new resources, certification and a code of ethics and conduct.

Once again, the coffee sector made proof of great resilience, amidst extreme weather events and major constraints in international logistics. The strength of our supply chains has allowed us to buffer some of the external impacts and look more confidently towards the future as the coffee market reshapes with new trends and demands. Also as a consequence, Sancoffee could even extend our work to a larger number of small coffee growers in Campo das Vertentes, embracing new associations and creating a new program designed to and by women growers, whose first lots we proudly exported this season.

Sustainability is a core value for Sancoffee, therefore we remained very active in the social and environmental arenas in 2021. We take a very practical approach on this matter selecting or building projects in which we can measure and follow up results in order to achieve our aimed impact. Out of these projects we highlight the renovation of a local public kindergarten that has been totally concluded this year. On the environmental side, besides the continuation and expansion of bio recovery and preservation projects on several farms, we are advancing on the understanding of the carbon footprint at farm level. 
